STARTING THE NEW YEAR OFF RIGHT

"And so this is Christmas, and what have you done..." hails the lyrics of one of my favorite songs played repeatedly over the Holidays. Though contrary to the original purpose behind John Lennon and Yoko Ono's 1971 peace song "Happy Xmas, The War Is Over", it strongly resonates into each of our lives, especially in today's age of detachment and indifference. For some of us the last few years have been a financial healing process while others suffered losses in their lives. One thing stands true regardless of what stage we are at in our perpetual journey, that we are all going through it together. Now this doesn't necessarily mean that someone else is going to pay off my Christmas bills, though the thought that we are all one big family living on this big shiny ball should give us a sense of security, even if it is only someone reminding me "It will all work out, it always does". And that is exactly what John and Ono were talking about, social justice for others in our community. How we help each other. How we treat each other. How we purposely close our eyes to things that are needed around us, letting that detachment control how we live our lives.

Yes, I am certain that we have all been burned by someone along the way, which is why most people stop helping others. Though if we all "assume" someone else will take care of it, nothing really gets accomplished. I have seen this many times in my own home, where dishes will pile up in the sink or laundry in the hamper. If all of us continue to be detached from the situation, or remain indifferent, dishes will continue to pile up and laundry will overflow the hamper and the house begins to host a hideous odor.

The same thing rings true with businesses, specifically non-profits. Like businesses, non-profits do have overhead they must acquire in order to run day to day. Utilities, rent, office equipment, supplies and staff are all vital aspects to running a non-profit. If we don't have these basics, man power included, their mission to the community they serve will not happen. The Holidays and year end tax write offs are how many non-profits get through the second half of their fiscal year. And since we have seen in the news so many non-profits doing negative things, it can leave a black eye for those organizations who truly do good things for others. How do we know exactly who the charities are serving when we see so many of them redistributing funds?

The answer is simple. First you must have the heart to see what the organization is doing to help; what their mission is. Once you know that, decide if this is important to the community it is serving. If so, who is it serving? If you still have uncertainties, contact the organization, visit them, volunteer with them to see what things they are doing. All of these organizations survive by utilizing viable volunteers. When a non profit doesn't have volunteers, we have more overhead and... well, you get the point.

If we as a community begin to understand that our society in general has started down the road of detachment and indifference, maybe we can begin a process of finding concern and interest for the people and the needs around us.

A very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, let's hope it's a good one, without any fears.



Local potter Dawn Tagawa produces stunning work displaying many vibrant, colorful and natural elements. Currently an Asheboro resident, Dawn hails originally from Coastal Carolina and has worked closely with potters in the Seagrove area.

After moving to the Randolph County area, she studied advertising, which has helped her establish her thriving pottery business, Tagawa Collection Pottery here in Asheboro. Her work hosts organic designs which are unique, and sport earthen colors of the desert as well as that of the sunset.
